

# BOISE ST BRONCOS

## POSITION OUTLOOK FOR 2009

**QUARTERBACKS** - The Boise St QB position reminds me of Texas Tech. Tech has had plenty of outstanding QB's that put up big numbers but Graham Harrell stepped in as the first VHT and had the best success of all. Boise has had some fine QB's in recent years with Bart Hendricks being the Off MVP of the Big West in each of his final 2 years ('99 & '00) and Ryan Dinwiddie becoming the school's all-time leading passer (9,819). From '00-'03, Dinwiddie broke Danny Wuerffel's NCAA record for career pass efficiency (168.79). Jared Zabransky started for 3 seasons and as a senior threw for 2,587 (66.3%) with a 23-8 ratio in 2006. Four QB's battled for the job in 2007 but Taylor Tharp won and had a fine season in his only year as a starter throwing for 3,340 (68.3%) with a 30-11 ratio. Michael Coughlin, who HC Petersen says has "all of the tools," played in 6 in '07 and was 2nd string in '08. Bush Hamdan (16 car att) was the most experienced of the 4 QB's battling in '08 along with soph Nick Lomax (PS#134) and VHT rFr Kellen Moore (PS#24). Hamden led out of the spring but I projected Moore as the starting QB and he narrowly won the job in Aug and Lomax quit later that month. Moore was the first frosh to start the season opener for Boise at QB and was the Walter Camp National OPW vs Oregon. He threw for 3,486 hitting a super 69.4% with a 25-10 ratio. Hamdan got in 20 passes (7 gm) and Coughlin just 5 (6 gm). This year backing up Moore is Coughlin, Drew Hawkins (6'2" 180 rFr, PS#240) and this year's true frosh. While it would be tough for Moore to improve much upon LY's numbers, he is more experienced.

**RUNNING BACKS** - In 2005, no RB topped 100 yards until the 9th game. Lee Marks had 7 starts and led with 759 (5.7). RFr Ian Johnson (PS#181) led in rushing 7 times finishing with 663 (5.6). Johnson was the only experienced returnee in '06 and burst onto the scene with 240 and 5 TD's vs Oreg St. Johnson set a school record with 1,713 (6.2) and led the NCAA in TD's with 25. He also was 8th in the Heisman balloting and had 100+ in 6 of the last 7 (DNP vs USU - inj). In 2007, Johnson missed two full games. He still became the first Boise RB to have B2B 1,000 yard seasons (1041, 5.0) since Brock Forshey (2001-'02). When he was out, Jeremy Avery rushed for 110 vs LT (79 yds rec) and 124 vs Fresno. DJ Harper had 153 vs Fresno. All 3 split the duties in '08. Johnson led with 766 (5.1), Avery was #2 with 614 (5.5) and Harper had 265 (4.8). Doug Martin (Scout Tm MVP true) had 107 (4.5). This year Johnson (11 st, 2nd Tm WAC) departs and not listed below are Jarvis Hodge (5'9" 202 Jr), who has 181 yds (5.3) rush in 2Y, Matt Kaiserman (6'0" 194 rFr) and FB Andy Sillsby (5'11" 221 Sr). Despite the loss of Boise's most recognizable player, this group could match last year's numbers.

**RECEIVERS** - In 2007, Boise had a very inexperienced receiving corps. The top returners were VHT Jeremy Childs (PS#39), who had just 152 (10.9) and Vinny Perretta, who had 124 (7.3) in '06. Perretta (inj) played in just 4 (9 rec) while Childs set a school record with 82 grabs (12.7) in '07. True frosh Titus Young (PS#152) and Austin Pettis (PS#127) finished #2 and #3 with 639 (14.5) and 465 (10.1), respectively. Last year they had to replace their starting TE and Childs was susp'd in the spring. Perretta was #2 in '08 with 578 (16.1) while Pettis (#3) and Childs (#1) combined for 1,369 (16 TD's). They lost starting TE Chris O'Neill to a broken foot so Kyle Elaw was the top TE with 262 (15.4). Young had just 168 (16.8) playing in just 3 (susp). This year they must replace Childs (10 st), Perretta (11 st), O'Neill (4 st, 13.1), Julian Hawkins (10 st, 32.2, 12.4), Toshi Franklin (2 rec) and Tanyon Bissell (6 rec). Not listed below are TE's Sean King (6'3" 230 Jr) and Josh Hill (6'5" 223 rFr, PS#173).

**OFFENSIVE LINE** - Four times this decade Boise has had to replace 3 starters and in the first 3 years opened holes for 4.1, 4.8 and 4.6 ypc rushing. In 2005 they had 3 starters back and avg 4.7 (4.9% sk). In 2006 with 3 starters back (lost #2 DC), the unit

paved the way for 5.1 ypc, their best IA total ever (6.5% sk). The '07 unit featured their most experienced line this decade with 4 starters back and they allowed just 4.1% sacks. Boise's ypg rush did drop to 185 (4.6). Last year they had the least experienced line of the decade as 5 of the top 6 were gone (lost 101 car st). The one returnee was 1st Tm WAC Andrew Woodruff. They used 4 different OL combos the first 6 weeks and 9 for the year and dropped to 152 ypg rush (4.4), their lowest total since 2003 but did allow just 13 sacks (3.0%). This year they lose Woodruff (13 st, 3Y str) and OG's Jon Goff (12 st) and Ben Iannacchione (6 gm). Their 40 career starts are still #101 in FBS. While they do lose their top player, they are a more experienced group.

**DEFENSIVE LINE** - Boise had 7 of their top 8 DL's back for the 2nd straight year in 2006 and allowed just 89 ypg rush (3.2), their best since joining IA. In 2007 they had to replace 2 starters and 3 backups and slipped to 131 ypg (3.8), their most since 2000. Last year they had to replace 2 starters (1 bkup). Jarrell Root was lost after 2 starts and Ryan Winterswyk took over earning 1st Tm WAC. Boise improved to allowing 118 ypg (3.2). This year they lose 2nd Tm WAC DE Mike T. Williams (12 st, 35 tkl, 4 sk) and DT's Joe Bozиков (9 st, 26 tkl, 1 sk), Steven Revels (3 st, 14 tkl) and Sean Bingham (10 st, 14 tkl, 3 sk). I look for a big year out of VHT Byron Hout (PS#30LB) who had 27 tkl and 4 sacks as a true. This is their most inexperienced line in a while, but should come close to last year's standards.

**LINEBACKERS** - Last year Boise ret'd all 3 starters who were than the #1, #3 and #4 tacklers and all veteran seniors. Daron Mackey (PS#99JC) tore his ACL while returning starter Dallas Dobbs lost his job (22 tkl). This year they lose Kyle Gingg (12 st, 76 tkl, 2.5 sk), Tim Brady (11 st, 42 tkl) and Dobbs (2 st). This unit is always good but they do lose their #2, #3 and #7 tacklers while ret'ing their #5 and #11 and are less experienced than the veteran 2008 unit.

**DEFENSIVE BACKS** - Boise finished #8 in my pass D rankings in '02, #6 in '03 and #15 in '04. They dropped to #52 in '05 but with all 4 starters back in '06 moved up to #15. In '07 BSU had to replace two starters and only fell to #20. Last year they had to replace 2 starters including a 1st Tm WAC SS and a #5DC CB plus three others (comb 6 st, 58 tkl). Surprisingly, with 1 Sr and 2 Jr's, Boise actually climbed to #4 allowing an 8-22 net. Not listed in the PSL are Raphael Lambert (5'9" 197 rFr, PS#76RB) and Josh Borgman (5'7" 170 So). This year they lose 1st Tm WAC FS Ellis Powers (12 st, 78 tkl, 8 tfl, 1 int) but return 1st Tm WAC CB Kyle Wilson (5 int) and 2nd Tm WAC SS Jeron Johnson (3 int). This looks like the WAC's top secondary.

**SPECIAL TEAMS** - Boise has always had a top-notch ST unit and from '99-'05 they had rankings of #32, #23, #28, #28, #2, #4 and #19 until sliding to #59 in '06. They had 22 blk'd punts in that span but none in '06. In 2007 they had to replace their K, P and top KR but moved back up to #10. They blk'd 4 punts and 11

overall kicks. Kyle Brotzman won WAC STPW 3 times hitting 16-18 FG (long 47). True frosh P Brad Elkin (PS#45) played like a true at times and avg'd just 37.5 but had a super team net of 37.3. Last year they had to replace their top PR and KR but still moved up to #2. Kyle Wilson avg 14.2 on PR's (#12 in FBS) with 3 TD's. Brotzman did hit just 17 of 26 FG's (2-2 50+) but also took over as P (tm net 39.6). Boise also blk'd 2 punts and Brotzman had 13 TB's on 89 KO's in '08. Brotzman, Elkin and Wilson all return so this figures to once again be one of the top ST units in the country.

**COACHES** - When Dirk Koetter left for Ariz St, asst Dan Hawkins took over as HC and went 53-11, achieving the school's then-highest finish ever in the AP poll in 3 consecutive years including #12 in 2004. When Hawkins left for Colorado in '06, Chris Petersen (OC prev 5Y) took over. Petersen had been a Broyles' finalist twice and his offenses, in a 3 year stretch from 2002-'04, avg'd 45.6, 43.0 and 48.9 ppg, respectively. In his first year Petersen achieved a 13-0 record and #5 finish. He has a remarkable record of 35-4 and 2 undefeated regular seasons in his 3 years! His OC is Bryan Harsin who is in his 9th season on the Bronco staff (TE cch from '02-'05) and played here from '95-'99. The DC is Justin Wilcox who served as the Cal LB coach from '03-'05.

## PHIL'S FORECAST

Boise St dominated the WAC from 2002-'04 with a perfect 24-0 record in league play. In 2002 they outgained WAC foes by 208.4 ypg (+37.4 ppg). In 2003, despite having the fewest returning starters (10) in the WAC and facing both Fresno St and Hawaii on the road, Boise went 8-0 (+176.4 ypg and +29 ppg). In 2004, they had just 10 starters back and had to replace their outstanding QB but were +191.3 ypg (+25.6 ppg). In 2005, Boise had the fewest amount of lettermen lost in the league (13) so big things were expected. For the first time in history Boise was ranked in the preseason coaches' poll (#18). Not bad for a school that was in just its 10th year of IA ball. They had their streak of 31 straight WAC wins end at Fresno (27-7) and saw their home win streak end at 31 in their loss to BC in the bowl. Their 4 losses were the most in 5 years with 3 coming vs ranked foes. Boise still became the first team to win 4 straight WAC Titles since BYU (1989-'93). Boise was +70.1 ypg vs WAC (3rd best). I pointed out that the last time they were -8 in turnovers, they rebounded with a 12-1 record (2002). In 2006's magazine I projected Boise St to earn a BCS bowl berth. I had to sweat out a couple close games (WY and SJSt) but Boise ran the table and made it to the Fiesta Bowl. They had their incredible hook-and-ladder play which sent the game to OT where they beat Oklahoma. They finished #5 in the AP poll (5th straight WAC Title). In 2007 they had to replace their QB and had just 5 returning off starters. Boise came into '07 ranked #24 but a loss to Wash moved their record to 0-13 on the road vs BCS schools and stopped their win streak at 14. In the battle for the WAC Title they lost to UH on the road by 12 and then dropped their bowl to EC (also in Hawaii) by 3. In their 6th straight bowl they were without RB Johnson (injured after 4 carries) and top WR Childs (susp). Boise outgained WAC foes by 136.5 ypg. Last year I was surprised Boise was picked 2nd in the WAC heading into the season. They received a brand new blue surface on their field. Despite Fresno being the preseason WAC favorite, I had pegged Boise for 1st and they rolled to a dominating 12-0 regular season. Thanks to Oregon being banged up at QB and down to a 4th stringer at one point, BSU ended their streak of road losses to BCS schools by upsetting the #17 Ducks 37-32. At that point, they finally entered the polls at #17. Their only close game was Nevada, a 7 point win but they did lead 24-3. They made a point in the finale to wax Fresno 61-10. Boise outgained WAC foes by 188.3 ypg (better than their 13-0 team in '06) and their 8 wins were by an avg of 43-12. They are now 60-4 in WAC play (54-2 since '02). While Boise only lost by 1 to TCU in the bowl, they were outgained 472-250. This year they do lose their top RB and WR but will be the preseason favorite again. Boise is just 1 of 10 teams in the NCAA to finish in the Top 20 in both the AP and USA Today poll in at least 5 of the past 7 years. Boise and USC are the only 2 teams over the past 7 years to win 80 games, make 7 bowls and win at least 6 conf titles out of those 10. Seven of my 9 sets of power ratings pick Boise to go 13-0 which makes them the prime candidate to be this year's BCSbuster.

Boise is 3-11 vs Pac-10 schools with all 3 wins vs teams from Oregon ('04, '06 & '08). LY Boise upset #17 Oregon 37-32 for their first win on the road vs a BCS team.

First meeting. BSU is 5-3 vs current MAC tms including a 20-7 win hosting BG LY. Could apply: The Broncos are 13-3 off of a loss since 1999.

Boise has won 7 of 8 winning by 24 ppg. One of BSU's 2 WAC losses S/'02 was here ('05). LY's gm was tied at 10 with under 2.0 left in the 1H & BSU scored 51 unanswered pts.

Boise is 2-0 vs BG as this will mark their 1st trip to OH in this 2-for-1 series. Under Petersen, Boise St is 4-1 in reg season non-conf road games winning by an avg of 16 ppg.

Broncos are 3-0 vs UC Davis with the last win in '85. The Aggies went 5-7 LY including a 13-10 loss to San Jose. They led 10-6 before allowing a 64/7pl drive & a 17 yd TD w/'08 left.

Bonus: Boise has won 17 straight non-conference games on the "blue turf".

These 2 were WAC opponents from 2001-'04 with Boise winning all 4 by an avg score of 41-24. Boise St is also 15-2 vs current CUSA teams scoring an avg of 40 ppg.

Boise has won 7 of L8. Coming into '09, BSU is 60-4 in WAC play with a loss at UH in '07 costing them the conf title. LY they only led 10-7 at HT but had 5 int's & 7 sks in the 27-7 win.

BSU has won all 9 in the series & the 5 gms in Boise have had an avg score of 49-13. LY Boise didn't allow a FD until 1:18 in the 2Q & finished with a 28-9 FD edge.

Boise has won the L/9 with an avg score of 51-20. LY BSU led by 7 & stopped UN on 4th down from the BSU 31. Last time here ('07) they combined for 1,266 yds & 136 pts in 4 OT's.

Boise has won all 9 in this series. In the 4 HG's they won by an avg score of 53-11 including finals of 58-0 ('07) & 56-6 ('05). Boise has won 10 straight home finales.

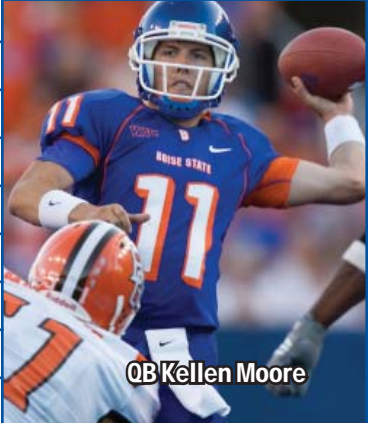
